

Notes for Contributors

Journal of Social Inclusion Studies is a peer-reviewed journal which publishes research articles, review articles, book reviews, commentaries and perspectives. The journal invites contributions to encourage understanding of issues relating to social exclusion and discrimination, particularly as experienced by people from excluded groups, and policies to promote social inclusion and equal rights and entitlements. The manuscript for contribution (word document) should be sent via email to the Editor at jsis@dalitstudies.org.in. The article should range between 5000-6000 words, commentaries around 1500 words and perspective around 3000 words. An abstract of around 100 words and 5-6 key words should be sent with each contribution. The book reviews should mention the name of book, author/editor, place of publication, publisher, publishing year, number of pages, ISBN no. and the price.

Format for Manuscript Submission:

- The manuscript should be in British English. Use “s” instead of “z” in the words like urbanisation instead of urbanization.
- The numbers from one to nine should be spelt out and 10 and more should be given in figures.
- The figures and tables used in the manuscript should be inserted at relevant places and should be referred to by their numbers in the text (for instance ‘See Figure 1’, ‘See Table 9’). All the tables and figures should mention their source which should be placed at the bottom of the tables and figures.
- Authors will be given a copyright form. Final submission of manuscript will be accepted only after duly filled copyright form is received by the Editor.
- The contributors should provide complete details of their affiliation, postal address, and email address along with the manuscript.
- Use endnotes instead of footnotes.
